

How to disable the firewall on CentOS

Remove all the firewall rules

- Connect as root and use the following command to remove all the firewall rules
 - o root@centos7~] # **iptables -F**
- Beware as the rules cannot be retrieve once they are removed

Temporarily turn off the firewall

- Connect as root and use the following command to remove all the firewall rules
 - o root@centos7~] # **systemctl stop firewalld**
- This command will only temporarily stop the firewall. The firewall will be back once the VM is rebooted.

Permanently turn off the firewall

- Connect as root and use the following command to remove all the firewall rules
 - o root@centos7~] # **systemctl disable firewalld**
- This command will permanently stop the firewall (even after a reboot) until it is started again.
